BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Triana, Alabama, through its governing authority, desires to provide a holiday day for municipal employees in recognition of Juneteenth.

WHEREAS, Juneteenth represents the day in history, June 19, 1865, when the last enslaved black Americans were emancipated in Galveston, Texas;

WHEREAS, the Juneteenth is an inordinately important historical day for the United States of America and its citizens;

WHEREAS, Juneteenth has been historically celebrated among black and African-American communities in the United States long before the date was observed as a state or federal holiday;

WHEREAS, many citizens, neighborhoods, and families in the Town of Triana celebrate Juneteenth and have done so before it became a federal holiday;

WHEREAS, the Town of Triana routinely observes many federal holidays on its municipal calendar;

WHEREAS, the 117<sup>th</sup> United States Congress passed Public Law 117-17, an Act cited as "Juneteenth National Independence Day Act", to make June 19 a federal holiday. Said Act was signed by the President of the United States on June 17, 2021;.

THEREFORE, the Town Council hereby declares Juneteenth as a municipal holiday and will observe said holiday on June 19 of each year, unless that date falls on a Saturday or Sunday, in which case the municipal holiday will coincide with the holiday date observed by the federal government calendar.
